Second Semester Mission Project: *Taste of Ethiopia*

The students of St. Paul's will be joining many of the other area Lutheran schools, along with Wisconsin Lutheran High School, in their annual Our Hands for His Service (OHFHS) project. The mission project will partner with a group called Pay It Forward Ethiopia which runs and operates a food truck called Taste of Ethiopia. In addition to providing food for children when they are at school, Pat and Tesfaye (a WLC graduate) Joyce are working toward creating a center called Lighthouse for Children, where children can go after school to be safe and to hear about a loving Savior named Jesus. We have raised \$74.17 to date. Thank you!

SCRIP

SCRIP is an easy way to raise money for your school and yourself - 50% of the profit goes to school and 50% goes toward your child's tuition for next year. Orders can be dropped off in the school office on Fridays, and you may pick up your order on the following Friday in the school office. Simply fill out the form and send it in with a check payable to St. Paul's SCRIP. Some items can be purchased Friday mornings "to go" cash-n-carry.

School Cancellations

As winter continues to move forward, there is a chance that school will need to be cancelled because of the snow or cold temperatures. **St. Paul's Lutheran School will follow the decision of the Cudahy Public School District when it comes to the closing of school for inclement weather. If Cudahy cancels school for inclement weather, we will be closed as well.** You should see the name of our school on your local television station's list of cancellations. It should also be mentioned on both WTMJ and WISN radio. We will try and send out a morning email if school is cancelled, as well as a posted note on Facebook.

Snow/Cold Days

You might be wondering if we are at a point where we need to make up any of the school days that have been cancelled for the cold and snow. The DPI requires 1,137 hours of instruction for our 7-8 graders, and 1,050 hours of instruction for grades 1-6. Our current calendar has 1,169.08 hours or 4.645 extra school days built in. Now that we have had 4 cold/snow days, we will need to make up hours in grades 7-8 if we have any additional days off. That news was shared with the 7-8 graders on Wednesday.
